
There are times in this life, for those of us who are especially curious, that reveal to us places, people, things that were so close to us all along; yet we somehow missed them over and over again until one fateful day.

Committee.


Properties are owned here and the campground is open from April thru October. It is a little piece of heaven for those who are lucky enough to be a part of it all.

that as life is lived, experiences are formed, memories are tucked away and words are ripe for the picking to express it all.



Dad showed me how to bait the hook and cast the rod. After a few moments dad told me it was time for him to go back to work but he would come back for me soon. I remember dad's truck pulling away from the lake and I wondered why dad couldn't take time for me. For years I knew all dad did was work. We didn't play ball or go on picnics ... everything was centered around work. I grew up just like my dad working everyday trying to run a business and provide for my family. I now realize I made all the same mistakes he did. Don't get me wrong; my

dad is my hero ... without his teachings I would not be the man I am today but I failed in giving my children the time they deserved.

My oldest daughter wonders why I never made time to go visit her in the military, my son wonders why I don't spend more time being a dad and less time being a boss ... my youngest ... well, I still don't know what she's thinking. I wonder why I never took my children to Disney land why I haven't taken a vacation in 15 years. My wife tells me I never shut down that every thought and moment is business. I tell her I don't know any other way.

I'm not sure if I'm writing this story to tell my family I'm sorry or if I'm trying to tell others don't make the same mistakes. I need to learn to take time for my family before there is no time left. I hope after reading this story everyone including myself makes a little extra time today for family.

From The Pulpit

"When all else fails, read the instructions."

No doubt you've seen these familiar words on a bumper sticker or poster. It seems like pretty sage advice; especially pertinent for those of us of the male gender. Too often we guys have the tendency to immediately lay aside the written instructions in favor of the "challenge" of assembling whatever it might be in the manner which "seems right" to us. Providing the thing works (even if we do have a few "spare" parts left over) we figure we've "won." However, if the thing doesn't perform as advertised....well...then (and usually only then) we might deign to see what "assistance" those discarded instructions can provide in "adjusting" our work.

As a Christian minister, I was suddenly brought to the realization that this saying needed some tweaking. After teaching several weeks on how Bible study is key to Christians being able to avoid repeating the mistakes of the past, one of my students presented me with a T-shirt that had this slogan prominently emblazoned above a picture of the Bible. Seeing this phrase applied specifically to Scripture, I was immediately struck with its intrinsic flaw. I grabbed a permanent marker, lined through the word "When" and wrote a new word above it in big, block letters, bringing it in line with a Biblical world view.

"BEFORE all else fails, read the instructions."

All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness; so that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work. 2 Timothy 3:16-17 (NASB95)

God bless those churches where, not only is His Holy Word read, but where it is both believed and acted upon in a timely manner.



Texas Style BBQ Brisket

- •1 (15 oz.) bottle Liquid Smoke
- •1 tsp. onion salt
- •1 tsp. garlic salt


- •1 small bottle Worcestershire sauce
- •1 bottle Jack Daniel's Original Number 7 Recipe BBQ sauce
- •3 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 4 lb. beef brisket



Marinate brisket overnight wrapped in foil. Marinate in Liquid Smoke, Worcestershire sauce, onion salt, garlic salt, and BBQ sauce mix. Next day, cook brisket in a covered pan (i.e. roast turkey pan) at 250° for 8 hours, basting at regular intervals. Add additional BBQ sauce during final 30 minutes with foil open and lid off. Slice thin and enjoy y'all!




